The goal was to gather various items throughout the year and hand out 200 gift bags to the Unhoused during the Christmas season. Now, the group holds a once a month kindness day in the parking lot by Whitehern/City Hall. Throughout each month items are dropped off to different encampments.

Here is a list of items that are needed: hats, mitts, scarves, hot paws, blankets, coats, boots, tarps, sleeping bags, oversized ziplock bags for carrying their items to keep them dry. Prompts for Reflection

Central became the "Regimental Church of The Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders of Canada (Princess Louise's) in 1931. Those were peaceful days, but days of horror lay ahead. In the Second World War, in this one Regiment, 288 Argylls were killed in action; 808 were wounded; 72 became prisoners of war. The Colours which hang in the Chancel honour those who answered the call.



The "*Argyll Poppy*" was designed for the Argylls by Lorraine DeGroote, wife of the Regimental Historian, Rob Fraser.
